Collect

Almighty and everlasting God, you have given us your servants grace, by the confession of a true faith, to acknowledge the glory of the eternal Trinity and in the power of the divine majesty to worship the Unity: keep us steadfast in this faith, that we may evermore be defended from all adversities; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

First Reading

Isaiah 6.1-8

In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lofty; and the hem of his robe filled the temple. Seraphs were in attendance above him; each had six wings: with two they covered their faces, and with two they covered their feet, and with two they flew. And one called to another and said: 'Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory.' The pivots on the thresholds shook at the voices of those who called, and the house filled with smoke. And I said: 'Woe is me! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips; yet my eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts!' Then one of the seraphs flew to me, holding a live coal that had been taken from the altar with a pair of tongs. The seraph touched my mouth with it and said: 'Now that this has touched your lips, your guilt has departed and your sin is blotted out.' Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, 'Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?' And I said, 'Here am I; send me!'

Second Reading Romans 8.12-17

So then, brothers and sisters, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh-for if you live according to the flesh, you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. For all who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received a spirit of adoption. When we cry, 'Abba! Father!' it is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ-if, in fact, we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him.

Gospel Reading John 3.1-17

Now there was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, a leader of the lews. He came to lesus by night and said to him, 'Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God; for no one can do these signs that you do apart from the presence of God.' Jesus answered him, 'Very truly, I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God without being born from above.' Nicodemus said to him, 'How can anyone be born after having grown old? Can one enter a second time into the mother's womb and be born?' lesus answered, 'Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. What is born of the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit. Do not be astonished that I said to you, "You must be born from above." The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit.' Nicodemus said to him, 'How can these things be?' Jesus answered him, 'Are you a teacher of Israel, and yet you do not understand these things? 'Very truly, I tell you, we speak of what we know and testify to what we have seen; yet you do not receive our testimony. If I have told you about earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you about heavenly things? No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. 'For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. 'Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him.

Sermon by The Revd Sarah du Boulay, Pentecost/Civic Service, 19th May at Aldeburgh

Happy Birthday! If you are of a religious persuasion, or have had a chance to read the introduction on the inside cover of our service booklet today, you will know that today we celebrate Pentecost – the official birthday of the church. Big C, all denominations – Anglican, Catholic, Baptist, Methodist, all of us. The Christian Church. So you join us on a very special day, and we are thrilled to celebrate with you.

Now, as we have just heard from our Bible readings, Pentecost is when we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit. Described both as a rush of violent wind, and as tongues of fire, the day of Pentecost was when the Holy Spirit came down upon Jesus' apostles and gave them the ability to speak in different languages.

In our Gospel reading, the Holy Spirit was referred to, by Jesus, as the Advocate. Now as we all know, an advocate is somebody who publicly recommends or supports another. That is the purpose of the Holy Spirit – to publicly support each one of us. Although, actually, 'advocate' is a slightly lazy translation of the original Greek. A better translation is 'comforter'. An even better word though, is the original word itself – Paraclete. Paraclete literally means 'to come alongside'. The Holy Spirit is sent to come alongside us. To offer us support, strengthen, intercede, counsel, comfort, and help.

That is the point of Pentecost. The point of Pentecost is the gift of the Holy Spirit. So what should the result of this gift be? The result of Pentecost should be sharing the Good News of the Gospel with all nations. With all people. With those inside this church and those outside it.

The Holy Spirit has given us the ability to communicate the Good News of Jesus Christ – the fact that Jesus had been born, had lived, had died and then been brought back to life again, before being taken up into heaven, where, we are promised, he is waiting there for us to join him.

That is the Good News of Jesus. That through his actions here on earth, God has cleared the way for us to have eternal life. That when our earthly lives end, we have the chance to live forever, with him, in what we call heaven. The good news is hope. And love. And life itself.

I often joke that if you think about the church in terms of marketing, we should be full to the brim. We have the best product in the world – Jesus. We just don't always know how to market him properly!

But the exciting thing is, that if you are sitting here today. If you have heard the word of God. If you have been baptised or confirmed. If you come up for communion or a blessing later on in the service. If you join in with any prayers, then the Holy Spirit is with you. The Holy Spirit will give you everything that you need to spread the good news of the Gospel – to be a witness to God throughout your life. You have everything you need.

You can tell everybody that you know where to go to receive everything that God has promised us. You can tell everybody that you know where to receive forgiveness for all your wrongdoings. You can tell everybody that you know where you can always find welcome. Find meaning. Find acceptance. Find a greater love than you can ever begin to imagine. From the God who created us, sustains us, loves us, redeems us, and will be with us forever.

When preparing this sermon, it occurred to me how apt it is to be celebrating Mayor's Sunday on the same day as Pentecost. It's a clumsy comparison, and I don't want to push it too far, but the words advocate, helper, support, counsellor, comforter, strengthener, all could equally well apply to the position of Mayor. TJ will be taking on all these roles over the next year. Of course, she won't be doing it alone. She will have the support of her Town Councillors, her friends and family, and the whole town. And also, I believe with all of my heart that TJ will take on the duties of Mayor with the support and power of the Holy Spirit. I will be praying for your year in office, and all it will bring.

And for everybody here. Take comfort and strength for the presence of the Hoy Spirit in your lives. Know that you are never alone. Know that God has ensured He will always be with you. And know that your local church, here at St Peter and St Paul will always welcome you and offer you a home.



And the sun shone brightly too!
